
MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Command Policy Memorandum – FTNGD-CD Medical Standards

1. Purpose: To clarify policy on the medical standards for Florida National Guardsmen entering Title 32 tours with the Florida National Guard Counterdrug Program.
2. Applicability: This policy applies to both the Army and Air components of the Florida National Guard.
3. Procedures: In addition to meeting criteria listed in the published job announcement, all Florida Army/Air Guardsmen applying for Title 32 tours with the Florida National Guard Counterdrug Program will meet the induction medical standards outlined below prior to selection/accession into the FLNG Counterdrug Program.

a. Florida Army Guardsmen will meet the induction standards as defined in AR 40-501, Chapter 2, (Physical Standards for Enlistment, Appointment, and Induction). FLARNG members must have a MEPS induction physical within 18 months prior to entry and a current HIV test within 180 days prior to entry. FLARNG members age 40 or older must have satisfactorily passed a CVS exam. If physical is over 18 months, soldier may request a new examination through a Military Entrance Processing Station (MEPS) or active component military treatment facility authorized to conduct such examinations. Cite NGR 500-2 and this policy memorandum as authority.

b. Florida Air Guardsmen will meet the induction standards as defined in AFI 48-123, Attachment 3 (Medical Standards for Appointment, Enlistment, and Induction). FLANG members must have a MEPS induction medical examination within 18 months prior to entry and a current HIV test within 180 days prior to entry. FLANG members age 40 or older must have an exercise tolerance treadmill test if the Cardiac Risk Index (CRI) is 10,000 or greater. If physical is over 18 months, airman may request a new examination through a Military Entrance Processing Station (MEPS) or active component military treatment facility authorized to conduct such examinations. Cite NGR 500-2 and this policy memorandum as authority.
